COVID-19 in Windsor and Essex County: March 20, 2020 to April 8, 2020

Purpose


• Providing an epidemiologic summary of COVID-19 activity in Windsor and Essex county to date

Highlights

- There are currently 244 confirmed cases of COVID-19 in Windsor and Essex County between March 20th and April 8th.
- The percentage of cases has decreased since the notification of the first positive COVID-19 in WEC
- The age of the cases range from 8 to 99 years (median of 51 years) with males making up 40% of all cases compared to 59% of females with 1% still to be determined.
 - o The majority of the cases are between 50 to 59 years of age.
 - 28% of the cases in females are between the ages of 50 to 59 years of age while 22% of males within 50 to years of age
- 34% of cases reported travel history prior to becoming ill, 30% had close contact with a confirmed case of COVID-19 and 26% of cases reported an unknown source of exposure linked to possible community acquisition.
- 62% of cases reporting a travel history identified travelling to Michigan prior to becoming ill with COVID-19
- Just over one in three cases were a healthcare worker and nine percent of cases reported visiting a health care facility prior to becoming ill.
- Just under 10% of cases are currently hospitalized and 67% of cases are currently in self-isolation.
- The cases in Windsor and Essex County are currently doubling more than every two days since April 4th. Prior to this date, cases were doubling every two days or less based on date reported to the health unit.




Figure 3. Percent Positivity of Individuals Tested for COVID-19 in Windsor and Essex County, March 4 to April 6, 2020 (n=1,659)


Age & Sex Distribution


Figure 5. Confirmed cases of COVID-19 by exposure history in Windsor and Essex County, March 20 to April 8, 2020 (n=244)



Healthcare Worker Status


Figure 7. Confirmed cases of COVID-19 by healthcare exposure in Windsor and Essex County, March 20 to April 8, 2020 (n=244)


